Saturday 9th - Head of the River Rowing Regatta (Galway)

This year the exciting Head of the River starts at the mouth of Lough Corrib and finishes just short of the Quincentennial Bridge in Galway City. The first race starts at 10.30 and every year hundreds of keen rowing teams converge to take part – with more besides who'd rather watch the spectacle.

March 14th to 17th - Louisburgh Drama Group presents ‘The Righteous are Bold’

A play written by Westport native Frank Carney, which was first produced in the Abbey Theatre, Dublin in 1946 where it ran for a 16 weeks. The central theme of the play is one of demonic possession, a young girl returns home from England to her family's cottage high upon the side of a wild and wind swept Croagh Patrick; Her parents, not knowing what is ailing her call upon the local Priest and doctor who's different approaches and opinions collide as they attempt their treatment.

17th – St. Patrick's Day

Dip in and out of the week-long St. Patrick's Festival in Galway starting on Monday the 11th or on the day itself there will be a parade in almost every town in the locality – with Clifden, Roundstone, Louisburgh and Westport all putting their best floats forward.

Closest to here will also be a weekend-long St' Patricks Spring festival in Louisburgh only a 20 minute drive from the Lodge.

Thursday 21st to Sunday 24th - The 2013 Connemara Pony Spring Festival
